WHEN YOU MEET WITH US, WE WILL ASK SOME QUESTIONS ABOUT YOUR PROJECT OR QUESTIONS TO DETERMINE HOW TO HELP YOU. THESE QUESTIONS INCLUDE:



What is the timeline for answering this question/completing this project?

What resources does your organization/community have (including time, space, and finances) to put towards the project, if any?

Who would lead your group's involvement in the project?

Who else should be involved (e.g. Elders, Knowledge Keepers, advisory group)? To what degree does your community/organization want to be involved in the research process?

What have you done, if anything, to answer your research question so far?

How do members of your community/organization feel about this topic/project?

What processes does your community or organization have for making decisions and/or working together that you would like to bring to this project? (e.g. Ceremony, research principles or protocols)

DEPENDING ON THE TIMELINE AND NATURE OF YOUR PROJECT, AND THE RESOURCES AVAILABLE, DIFFERENT OPTIONS THAT MAY WORK FOR HELPING YOUR ORGANIZATION MAY INCLUDE:

Helping you to find an answer to your question from already available research data

Helping you identify funding opportunities to leverage your contributions towards the project (cash and in-kind)

Connecting you with a faculty researcher and graduate students who are interested in working with you to complete a project for your organization

Connecting you with a faculty researcher and student researchers who can help you address your question as part of a Community Service Learning Project

Helping you to put together a research team to complete a larger-scale project
