

True/False Tests

- ◆ Always read directions
- ◆ For a statement to be true, it must **ALL** be true.
- ◆ Identify key words or phrases.
- ◆ Statements that contain absolute words are *usually* false (always, all, none, never, only, every, no).
- ◆ Statements that contain qualifying words are *usually* true (usually, often, may, can, sometimes, frequently, rarely, most, some, many, few, generally).
- ◆ Statements that contain negative words require careful attention.



1. When you read the directions pay attention to how you are to mark the items. Pay attention to the point value scheme
2. If any part of the statement is false, the entire statement is false. Even if a statement is composed of two or three parts or entire sentences, if one part or even one word is incorrect, the entire statement is false. Is this true or false

The correct answer is “false”. Even though the first part of the statement is correct, the second part is not. We have just learned that reading over the material several times is not an effective way to become actively involved with the material.

3. Some students look for “tricks” or read too much into the questions when a true/false item seems too easy. If you are properly prepared for a test, some true/false items should appear to be easy.
