### Ontario Supporting Agri-Food Research in Thunder Bay

Ontario is transferring the operating and research programming of the Thunder Bay Agricultural Research Station to Lakehead University to help foster innovation and strengthen Ontario's competitive edge by expanding agri-food research in Northwestern Ontario.

**Bill Mauro, MPP for Thunder Bay-Atikokan**, made the announcement on behalf of Jeff Leal, Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs in Thunder Bay on December 8.

The partnership with Lakehead University will support the long-term sustainability of the Thunder Bay Agricultural Research Station (TBARS) and will increase the university's capacity to build new programming and research that will benefit Northwestern Ontario.

The agricultural research station will be known as the Lakehead University Agricultural Research Station (LUARS).

## Achieving Excellence in Teaching, Learning, and Research

### Dr. Tocheri receives an international Field Discovery Award

On December 17, it was announced that Lakehead University's Dr. Matt Tocheri would be recognized by the Shanghai Archaeology Forum for his research on *Homo floresiensis* at Liang Bua in Indonesia.

Eight years of excavations and study have pushed back the time of disappearance of the 'hobbits' of Flores (*Homo floresiensis*) from as recently as 12,000 years ago to about 60-50,000 years ago – around the same time that modern humans (*Homo sapiens*) first dispersed through the wider region and reached Australia.

The new findings were published in *Nature* in 2016 in an article entitled *Revised stratigraphy and chronology for Homo floresiensis at Liang Bua in Indonesia*.

### Lakehead hosts Pan-Northern Mining Research Alliance

Lakehead University hosted the second meeting of the Pan-Northern Mining Research Alliance on December 20, 2017. The Alliance was formed in response to the Canadian Federal Budget 2017, which expressed commitment to continued sustainable development of the mining sector.

University, college, industry, and funding partners across Northern Ontario gathered at Lakehead University to combine their research strengths and identify key priorities and strategic directions for the Alliance in 2018. The Pan-Northern Mining Research Alliance will support research on a global scale and enhance Northern Ontario's research strengths in mining-related areas for all post-secondary institutions. The Alliance will actively seek industry engagement, support and collaboration through targeted research opportunities that align with government.







## Expand our International Reach

### Cooperation Agreement between CALAREO and CONACYT

On November 24, 2017, in Mexico City, the newly established Canada Latin America Research Exchange Opportunities (CALAREO) consortium signed an agreement of cooperation with the Consejo Nacional de Ciencia y Tecnología (CONACYT). Lakehead University has partnered with Carleton University, Memorial University, Vancouver Island University, and the University of Lethbridge to form CALAREO.



The objective of this Cooperation Agreement is to establish a joint program, called CONACYT-CALAREO, for Mexican Master and Doctoral students to study at a CALAREO Member University with funding provided jointly through CONACYT and CALAREO. **Dr. Brian Stevenson**, Past President of Lakehead University, signed the agreement on behalf of CALAREO. **Enrique Cabrero Mendoza**, General Director, and **María Dolores Sánchez Soler**, Deputy General Director of Scholarships and Graduate Studies, signed the agreement on behalf of CONACYT. CALAREO and CONACYT look forward to providing opportunities for Mexican students to study at the partner universities in Canada.

The Secretariat for CALAREO will be located at Lakehead University.

### Lakehead joins Ontario Premier's Mission to China and Vietnam

Dr. Andrew P. Dean, Vice-President (Research & Innovation), was in China and Vietnam between November 26 – December 6, 2017 as part of Premier Kathleen Wynne's Ontario Business Mission.

During the mission, Dr. Dean visited Nanjing, Chongqing, and Shenzhen in China and Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi in Vietnam. In Chongqing, Dr. Dean participated in a roundtable discussion, chaired by the Premier, which highlighted potential collaborations and future developments in science, technology, and innovation between Canada and China. Dr. Dean highlighted advancements in research at Lakehead University, particularly in the areas of cleantech, agriculture, energy, and advanced manufacturing. At the roundtable, Dr. Hong Xiang, Director of Key Laboratory of Dependable Service Computer in Cyber Physical Society, Chongqing University, presented on cyber security advances in China. Dr. Xiang actually completed his Master's degree at Lakehead University in the Department of Mathematics and Computer Science in 1992.



## Lakehead expands partnerships in Mexico

During 2017, Lakehead University hosted 570 Mexican students in various short-term and semester-long ESL programs, customized ESL programs in combination with academic courses, as well as full-time students in undergraduate and graduate programs.

In late November 2017, **Dr. Moira McPherson** visited Mexico to help further the relationships that Lakehead International has developed with approximately a dozen Mexican universities.

On her visit to the Technological University of Fidel Velázquez A. Villagran (UTFV), Dr. McPherson signed an MOU with Rector Roberto García Sevilla and the State of Mexico's Director General for Higher Education, Mr. Cuitlahuac Anda Mendoza.

UTFV sent 65 students on language training to LU in 2017, under the Proyecto 10,000 Program, financed through the government of the State of Mexico (EDOMEX). EDOMEX has committed to sending 400 students to Lakehead University in 2018, from various universities in the State of Mexico.
