Faculty have been busy this summer with our research, and are now enjoying being back in the classroom with you.


Remember that you can do a a lot with your Women's Studies degree, and that we're the only Department that will provide you with required public sector Core Competency training in each of our classes!

A Legal History of Adoption in Ontario, 1921-2015. University of Toronto Press/Osgoode Society Press, Fall 2016.

Lori's book traces the history of adoption law in Ontario from 1921, when the first *Adoption Act* was passed. She details the origins and passage of legislation and examines a series of legal changes and accompanying controversies, from debates about the meaning of consent by birth mothers, to samesex adoption.
