We propose to add the Intermediate/Senior concurrent Education option to the BASc Interdisciplinary Studies program at the Orillia Campus. Students have been desiring this option for the last 10 years and it is finally possible at Orillia. EDUC 1050, EDUC 2050, and EDUC 3xxx are already being taken by students in the BAScBEd PJ program, but this option allows them to take the Professional Program for Intermediate /Senior Education rather than Primary / Junior.

Program Requirements:

Five Year program

An overall 60% average through each year is required in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major, any additional elective Interdisciplinary Studies courses taken, and any additional elective courses taken in the disciplinary area. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 7 FCEs: two (2) FCE of Interdisciplinary Studies courses and five (5) FCEs in the disciplinary area. In Concurrent Education programs at the Intermediate/Senior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering degree program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements (see Degree Programs Information for Education requirements).

Students must choose two teachable subjects, the first of which is also the chosen discipline (5 FCEs) in the Interdisciplinary Studies major. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that the second teachable is met through electives. Eligible teachable subjects at Orillia include English, Environmental Science, Geography, History, Mathematics, Science—General, Science—Biology, Science—Chemistry, Social Sciences—General. See Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education, Levels and Teachables. A student registered in a Concurrent Education program must maintain a minimum cumulative average of 65%.

Note 1:

All students will satisfactorily complete four Interdisciplinary Studies courses: one-half (0.5) full course equivalents (FCE) at first-year level, Interdisciplinary 2010, Interdisciplinary 2030, and one-half (0.5) FCE at third-year level.

Note 2:

Students must complete five (5) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in one discipline: one (1) FCE at the first-year level, one (1) FCE at the second-year level, one (1) FCE at the second-year level or above, and two (2) FCEs at the third or fourth-year level. Eligible disciplines are Biology, Chemistry, English, General Science (as defined as a "Teachable" by the Faculty of Education), Geography, and History.

Note 3:

By the end of three years (15 FCEs), at least three (3) FCEs must be Type A (Humanities) or Type B (Social Sciences) courses; at least three (3) FCEs must be Type C (Engineering, Mathematical and Natural Sciences) or Type D (Health and Behavioural Sciences) courses; and at least one-half (0.5) FCE must be Type E courses. Interdisciplinary Studies (INTD) courses do not count towards these area requirements, unless they are being taken as an elective.

The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of one-half FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.

Note 4:

BASc students must complete a core disciplinary course in their discipline. These courses must be chosen from the following list: Anthropology 2137 (for General Science), Biology 2910, Chemistry 2111, Chemistry 2211, English 2250 and English 2251 (both are required for the English discipline), Geography 2232, Geography 2251, Geography 2271, any second year History course.

- (f) One-half FCE elective (Education excluded; Note the Type
 A, B, C, D, and E courses requirement)
- (g) Education 2050

Third Year:

- (a) One-half FCE in third year Interdisciplinary Studies
- (b) Two FCEs in discipline at third or fourth-year level
- (c) One half-course elective in second teachable subject at third or fourth-year level
- (d) One half-course elective in second teachable subject at second-year level or higher
- (e) One FCE elective at second-year level or
- higher (Education excluded; Note the Type A, B, C, D, and E courses requirement)
- (f)One-half FCE Education elective (see Electives in the Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education Courses list)
