Relying on our own experiences as guides, educators, interpreters, and anyone who has a relationship to the land, we reflect critically on the various ways we consciously and subconsciously resist and/or perpetuate these ideologies. We explore opportunities and limitations that land-based educators have as they attempt to contribute to build environmentally and socially just communities. A core concept in this course will be to critically reflect on this web or relationships as well as interrogate what "being in relationship" with another being (human and/or more-than-human) means.
