The concentration consists of five (5) FCEs: the two (2) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies 1013, 3013, and either 4823 or 4901 and three (3) FCEs beyond first year (including one (1) FCE at third or fourth year) chosen from the Environment, Society, and Culture Concentration Course List, ensuring representation from at least two disciplines (normally the two disciplines noted above, although electives may also be included).

Students must complete five (5) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in one discipline and five (5) FCEs in a second discipline: each discipline must include one (1) FCE each at the first-year level, one (1) FCE each at the second-year level, one (1) FCE each at the second year level or above, and two (2) FCEs each at the third or fourth year level.
