Rationale

The following changes are designed to address budgetary concerns with respect to Media Studies, attracting more majors to the program and reducing the number of Media Studies courses that we are required to offer each year. We are reducing the number of courses counted toward the major from 12 to 10 FCEs, which is in line with other Honours majors at Lakehead University. (Note that the Inquiry courses are still being required; they are just no longer being counted toward the major average.) In first and third year, asterisks are being removed from the first and third year Inquiry courses and being added to the first year selection of courses involved with media production to indicate that these courses will count toward the major in Media Studies . Neither INTD 1010 nor INTD 3010 are media specific courses, so they should not count as such, even though they are still required for the program. This will have no budgetary implications. The number of required Media Studies courses is being reduced in years two and three from 3.5 FCEs each to 3 FCEs each, and in fourth year from 3 FCEs to 2 FCEs. The required courses at third year are being altered slightly to include the option of taking third or fourth year courses during that year. This will enable students to take more electives and achieve a more

Rationale

There are a few minor changes to the program. First of all, the type A, B, C, and D courses breadth requirements are being identified more specifically and notes are added to the elective lines to remind students of the requirements. Secondly the Indigenous Content requirement is being met via Type E courses, as indicated in the note. Thirdly, in keeping with the new concentrations introduced this year, we are enabling students to fulfill the first and third year inquiry requirements via any of the first year and third year Interdisciplinary Studies courses respectively (INTD 1010, 10aa, 10xx, 10yy, or 10zz and INTD 3010, 30aa, 30xx, 30yy, or 30zz; see 2015-soc-5322 and 2015-soc-5324)

An overall B (70%) average in the Media Studies Major (courses designated with an asterisk-(*) are included, in addition to the Media Studies courses, in the calculation of the average for the Media Studies Major.First Year:(a) Media Studies 1010 and 1030(b) * One FCE chosen from General Science 0350, 0370; Media through each year is required.

Note:

By the end of four years (20 FCEs), at least three (3) FCEs must be taken from Type A or B courses and at least three (3) FCEs must be taken from Type C or D courses.

The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of one-half (0.5) FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.
