Position Summary:

Lakehead University Orillia is a member of the Ontario Collegiate Athletic Association (OCAA); we are seeking a passionate and experienced head coach for our Women's Varsity Soccer program. Reporting to the Athletics Coordinator, the successful candidate will work closely with the Athletics Coordinator and is responsible for developing a plan for the Women's Soccer program; this includes recruitment, student-athlete development, and evaluating the technical, tactical, and physical components of the team. This program prepares the student-athletes for successful competition within the Ontario Colleges Athletics Association (OCAA). This is a part-time position which will require evenings, weekends, and periodic weekday daytime hours, dependent on the competition schedule. The candidate must possess values consistent with the standards of Lakehead University and the Ontario Collegiate Athletics Association in developing academically strong student-athletes, while also establishing a competitive Varsity Women's Soccer program.

General Aspects of the Program:

- The Varsity Women's Soccer Program competes in Indoor Soccer through the OCAA during the Winter semester but will be entering Outdoor Soccer (OCAA) in the Fall of 2025 as well
- o Training will start in September to prepare for the jump to outdoor soccer the following year,



expectation is 3-4 sessions a week (Tryouts, practices, and friendlies)

 Indoor Soccer season starts in January and runs through March. This consists of approximately 3-5 tournaments, 1-2 Invitationals, Regionals in late February, and Provincials in March (must qualify). The team practices 3-4 times a week.

Responsibilities:

- Development of a program for the Women's Soccer team including an annual training plan to guide players and team development in practices and games
- o Promotion of the program, identification and recruitment of quality prospective student-athletes
- Working with the Athletics & Recreation Department for recruitment events to increase awareness of the Lakehead Orillia soccer program
- Ensuring the program goals and objectives align with the Athletic & Recreation Department's Mission, Vision, and Values
- Provide an inclusive, diverse, equitable, and holistic environment for student-athlete development
- Represent Lakehead University professionally and by the university's policies
- Must follow all OCAA policies and procedures
- Maintaining effective communication and administrative systems amongst all coaches, studentathletes, and athletics staff
- Ability to work evenings/weekends

Qualifications:

- Proven and established relationships with high school soccer coaches and/or clubs for recruitment purposes
- Minimum of 4 years of Head Coaching experience, preferably with student-athletes or high-performance athletes
- o Previous experience coaching female athletes is considered to be an asset
- Minimum certification: NCCP Train to Train & Train to Compete, Soccer Canada License considered to be an asset
- An excellent inclusive leader, with exceptional communication and mentoring skills
- o Strong interpersonal, team building, and conflict resolution skills
- Must have a valid class G license
- Must provide a clear police background check
