

Monday Evenings 7:00 pm through 10:00 pm During the upcoming winter semester the Philosophy Department will be offering a Special Topic course (2715) to be co-taught by adjunct professors Dr. C. Sacchetti-Dufresne and Dr. R. Matthews. This special course applies philosophy to major problems of our time – so think about taking the course, or just surveying it for interest.

This topic is of definite interest to philosophy, political science, and anthropology majors. Read more --

This half-course examines the multiple and divergent national and international understandings of "terrorism," genocide, and human rights. To this end, it explores liberal and Marxist notions of justice; traditional and contemporary theories of ethics; and current epistemologies that undergird the many meanings of violence and human rights. These philosophical approaches are considered in light of case studies from ethnographic, sociological, and historical work on a number of important themes, including: rape, torture, poverty, income inequality, gender and sexualities, race, and ethnicity.

This fall, Philosophy will host an event celebrating the publication of Dr. Blahuta's new book:


"Fortune and the Dao: A Comparative Study of Machiavelli, the Daodejing, and the Han Feizi."
